

No Name Pub

A must stop for Lower Keys Travelers

"As many of you know, this is one of my favorite places. On a recent trip to the Keys, I introduced a friend to the now popular spot. It brought back memories of the many friends I have introduced to No Name over the last 20 years. Glancing around the pub, many fond memories shared with great friends and fellow Parrot Heads came flooding back.

In the 40's the brothel was closed down because the fisherman were said to be more attractive then the working girls.

I would like to share a little No Name history with my Parrot Head Family. The building in 1930 was originally a general store and a bait and tackle shop. In 1936 a side room was built and the now famous Pub was born. In the late 1930's the upstairs was converted into a brothel in an attempt to increase business. In the 40's the brothel was closed down because the fisherman were said to be more attractive then the working girls. In the mid 50's the bait and tackle and the general store were closed. No Name was added to the Pub and it quickly became a Key's hangout. In the 60's two cooks from Italy

came over and the still famous pizza was introduced. When the cooks left they wrote the recipe on the kitchen wall so no one would ever forget it.

In the 70's and the 80's a lot of illegal money was passing through the Keys and No Name was a place many people would party and dance at. During that time it was the start of another now famous event, people putting dollar bills on the walls with special messages! Looking around the No Name during my last visit, I couldn't possibly recall where my dollar bills were or even how many I stapled to the walls over the years. There is now an estimated \$180,000 decorating the Pub and seating areas.

Although it is now a famous tourist spot, I feel blessed that a local friend took me to No Name Pub over 20 years ago and the building and the food hasn't changed. This is a must stop for any of you traveling in the Lower Keys. For me it is full of great memories with friends I will never forget and dollars I can't remember.

Jimmy sings of a D-18 played Lightfoot clear in the shops and bars along Rue de la Guitare or the Street of the Guitar. 510 Sycamore Street may not be the French Rue de la Guitar but rather the birth place of the D-18 and numerous other styles of perhaps the most sought after guitars in the world those created by the C.F. Martin company in Nazareth PA.

Recently Jerry Standefer, Gary Atkinson and I made the pilgrimage to Nazareth to see for ourselves how the guitars that have written so many of the songs we have all come to love were made. Upon arrival, we were greeted by the factory receptionist, a motherly woman with a warm smile and folksy demeanor. She issued us our "Back Stage Tour" badges and quickly pointed out a waiting area stocked with tens of thousands of dollars of the Martin product. Not behind glass or with signs that exclaimed do not touch, but to the contrary,





they were there just waiting to be sample-handled and played. I was drawn immediately to an amazing D15M. From the minute I picked it up and strummed the first chord, I knew what the allure of Martin was all about. Warm mid range tones, crystal clear bright trebles...but it's all about the bass. Deep rich bass tones born of the all mahogany construction. The D15M sounded as beautiful as it looked with it's natural satin finish.

Each and every day the 600 plus prideful Martin employees create 300 "American Made" works of art. Martin stocks 3 years worth of wood from around the world (some of it 400 years old) to produce their collector creations. They also construct a brand of synthetic wood that produces the same high quality sound for those enthusiasts on a limited budget.

Our two and a half hour tour flew by like a drunk friday night and as it came to an end and as we navigated our way past the museum and through the gift shop, someone asked which one I was going to take home. I simply replied "if I take one... I will no longer have a home to go to."
