Parrot Points

It pays to work on a committee and attend Club functions – you accumulate Parrot Points.

A benefit to all BCPHC members is that you are eligible to earn points towards the purchase of Jimmy Buffett concert tickets. If you haven't been inspired to read the BCPHC By-Laws, here's how the point system and eligibility for tickets works:

In compliance with Parrot Heads in Paradise, Inc. (PhiP), the BCPHC has established a point system for tracking and calculating members' participation in all Club functions and events. Members with the highest amount of accumulated points will be offered the opportunity to purchase Club-allotted concert tickets on an availability basis.

The Executive Board members of the BCPHC do not participate in the point accumulation schedule but are eligible for purchase of Club tickets by virtue of their positions. For all other Club members, points will be awarded as per the following schedule:

- Committee Chairs: 40 pts;
- Organize a charity event or community project: 20 pts;
- Volunteer/work at charity function or community project: 15 pts;
- Active committee members: 10 points;
- Attend meetings (business or committee): 10 points;
- Donate auction items:
 10 points;
- Special contributions/projects (e.g. write newsletter article):
 5 pts;
- Get new member: 5 pts;
- Attend charity function or social event: 3 pts;
- Additional points may be issued for other activities as determined by the Executive Board.

Parrot points will be calculated on a calendar year, beginning January 1.

Reminder – It is your own responsibility to sign in at every meeting and event you attend.






Directions to the Fish Pond West:

Casino Night


On Friday, March 17th (St. Patty's Day), the Club held Casino Night to benefit the Olivet Boys & Girls Club.


