to see the Sauce Boss (Bill Wharton) play at Shakey's in Hershey. The Sauce Boss mixes his own hot sauce and gumbo ingredients into a large caldron while playing spicy Florida Blues on his guitar. The audience is invited to help stir the pot and at the end of the show, everybody eats.









This will probably make enough to feed everyone at a large party or tailgate.

THE SAUCE BOSS' GUMBO

- 2 cups flour
- 1 chicken
- 1 gallon of chicken stock
- 2 large onions
- 2 large green peppers
- 1/2 cup LIQUID SUMMER HOT SAUCE
- 1 pound smoked sausage

- 2 medium zucchini
- 1 pound okra
- 1 pound of shrimp
- 1 pint of oysters
- 1 pound of crawdads

Make a roux: mix 2 cups of flour into 1-1/2 cups hot oil. Cook on high, stirring constantly until brown. Add 1 chicken, cooked and de-boned, 1 gallon of chicken stock, 2 large onions, and 2 large green peppers. Bring to a boil, then simmer down. Add salt to taste and 1/2 cup of . . . (drum roll) BILL WHARTON'S LIQUID SUMMER HOT SAUCE. Slice and add: 1 pound of smoked sausage, 2 medium zucchini, and 1 pound of okra. When the okra is done, bring the gumbo to a rolling boil and add 1 pound of shrimp, 1 pint of oysters, and 1 pound of crawdads. Cook for 3 minutes. Serve over rice and splash with Liquid Summer Hot Sauce.

PARROT HEADS GO "OVERBOARD" AT SEA

The Mako Mania Tournament at Bahia Marina in Ocean City, MD was held on June 6, 7, and 8, 2004. Anglers Jeff Blatt, Ted Kohl, Denny Lorah and Matt Vardjan fished the opening day to try their luck at catching the winning mako.

With the sun just rising through spotty clouds at 5:00 a.m., the boat cast off with all men aboard prepared for the two-hour ride to the "Jack" spot. The seas were predicted to be one to three feet inshore, building to three to five later during the day. Upon arriving at our destination, the engines were cut, chum buckets were tossed over the sides, and lines were thrown out to drift in the lengthening slick.

We waited for one hour before a bluefish was boated by Jeff. Shortly after, the first heavy hit of the day, a 130 pound brown dusky shark, was caught by Ted and then released. Jeff then caught a second bluefish. The second heavy hit, the first make of the day, was handed off to me. After a short fight, a 150 pound shark was cranked to the back of the boat. While attempting to tail-rope our first keeper, the shark gave one violent slap of its tail, snapped the line, and was gone! The four Parrot Heads were silent. Fins were neither to the left nor the right.

The wind blew harder and hours passed. We all feared that the previous shark might have been the only make of the day. "Hey guys," Denny said, "everything happens for a reason."

A few more hours passed and one of the chum buckets came loose from the boat so Captain Dusty Lorah said to bring in the lines and he'd retrieve it. As the lines were being cranked in, Ted shouted, "Hey, there's something on this line!" He set the strike and pulled to set the hook. He handed the rod off to Denny. All other lines were brought in this time, and all anglers determined that if this shark was a mako, it would be boated. Denny cranked the shark right to the boat. Jeff yelled, "MAKO!" And with that, the shark saw the boat and took off in the opposite direction. The fight was on! The shark was brought back to the boat two more times with the same result.

After some jumps by the shark, it was brought in, gaffed, and tail-roped. It took all four men to finally secure the



mako with three ropes. This shark was larger than the first mako - maybe 185 pounds, maybe 200. It just might win the tournament. All agreed that even if this one wasn't the winner, it would taste good for supper!

We thought it'd be good to start fishing our way toward shore. This was the first charter trip booked with Club member, Dusty Lorah, captain of the Overboard, a 32-foot Topaz, which now bares its first battle scares on the starboard side from the shark and gaffs.

According to tournament rules, 3:00 p.m. was quitting time. So the lines where cranked in and the make brought into the boat for the trip back to the scale to see if the weight estimates of the shark were accurate.

On the approach to the Bahia Marina, which is located at the back of Fish Tails, the dock was filled with people watching the sharks being weighed in. After fighting our way to the scale, the shark was hung. As photos were snapped, the scale numbers read 172.4 pounds. It was the 3rd place make of the day. But the excitement was short lived. Five minutes later, our shark was knocked down to 5th place.

We all agreed that it would still taste good for supper that night.

Parrot Daze Pfestival Raises Pfinancial Pfeathers

The proceeds raised by the event will help the Humane Society in its mission to help the 5,000 plus animals it houses each year to find happy permanent homes. Founded in 1900, the Humane Society of Berks County is the oldest and largest animal welfare organization in the county.

Over 400 Parrot Heads relished in Cheeseburgers of Fish Pond West Paradise with cold draft beers, boat (pond) drinks and basked in heavenly fall-like weather. And yes, these parrots frolicked to the Caribbean sounds of Captain Quint and Jimmy and The Parrots – Buffett-cover bands from Washington, DC.

It was with great glee that our Club met and exceeded the Chapter's mission to party with a purpose. That is "to promote friendship and organize social activities for people who share an affection for the tropical spirit of Jimmy Buffett AND a desire to contribute to the betterment of the community through a variety of volunteer efforts."

This volunteer effort translated into hundreds of hours of collective effort as well as contributions of thousands of dollars from individual and local businesses in silent (OK, less loud) and live auctions. Notable items contributed and auctioned were a Beach Week in the Keys, a Cannondale bicycle, a tiki bar and an assortment of tropical art, apparel and frills.

Karel Minor, Executive Director of the Humane Society of Berks County, thanked the crowd and Parrot Head Club for their generosity and support. "This money will make a huge impact on our organization. You sure know how to throw a fun fundraiser!" said Minor.


