

But did you know that Hal has been performing with Rock of Ages on Broadway for years? And did you know that he is producing a new TV show?


PP: How did you get to Broadway?

HBS: Rock of Ages had been off Broadway when it got picked up to move to Broadway. The main bass player that was doing the show takes off to do other tours just like everybody in the band. When it moved to Broadway he was having trouble finding subs to cover him and he called me.

PP: Did it help that you were close to NY?

HBS: There are a lot of Broadway musicians but they weren't comfortable on stage with the wig and all the makeup. They are used to being in the orchestra pit. You have to memorize the whole show. There's choreography, and you have to do a lot of this... (Hal holds up his hands in the familiar horn symbol – index and pinky finger nails painted black of course). He tried calling

a few "rock" players but you have to be really disciplined to play exactly the same every night because the singers and dancers rely on the parts you're playing for their cues.



HBS: Almost three years. It started on Broadway in April 2009 and I joined them in May 2009. It's nominated for five Tony Awards and the movie is out in June.

PP: Did you get a phone call for the movie?

HBS: Actually, I did. A lot of us did. They asked us if we wanted to be extras. It was shot last summer in Ft. Lauderdale but I couldn't make it. I may regret not going because the guys who went said it was fun and you can see them clearly on screen. When a Broadway show is successful they also do a touring company. Everyone in the band was the same except the bass player, and I was asked to tour. It's a week in every city. It's a big nine month commitment. You're gone. You don't go home. I said I would love to do it but I can't go away for that long. But I did fill in for a month.

PP: Where did you wind up going?

HBS: Philadelphia, Raleigh, (NC), then to New Orleans – which was really a blast – then right to Key West to play at MOTM. I was away for over a month but it was a lot of fun. I just got called for Chicago. I'm going out there to do four shows next month. It's such a blast to do the show on Broadway and then also get to do it on the road.

HBS: I've been doing the music end of a new show called Rock Star Kitchen. The Executive Producer is also the producer of Rock of Ages. It's a cooking show but each week has a different rock star as the guest. So far we've had Foreigner, Eddie Money, and Chubby Checker.
