- *Green Parrot* Home of the best Bloody Mary on the island. It's a necessary start to the day sometimes.
- *Hog's Breath Saloon* The outdoor stage is basically a big tent under a tree, but the regular entertainment here is top notch.
- Schooner Wharf Still a favorite, despite the fact that I was flagged ordering my third beer of the day. Ask me. I'll tell you the story.


