Caribbean Daze at Berks Jazz Fest

Berks County Parrot Heads were treated to a new genre of music at the 2003 Berks Jazz Fest. This year the festival added a "Caribbean Day." Aided by the marketing efforts of John Ernesto and the newly formed Berks County Parrot Head Club, hundreds of Parrot Heads, including some from neighboring PHC chapters, turned out for the events.

The afternoon show began with Berks County Club's own musician, John Hain and his band Mango Summers, warming up the crowd from the lobby balcony at the Lincoln Plaza Hotel.

The large crowd proceeded into the ballroom and was informed that the Catonsville, Maryland High School steel drum band was not allowed to make the out-of-state trip to the Jazz Fest due to the Iraq war. The band's instructor expressed the deep regret of his students and then introduced special guest, Robert Greenidge, Jimmy Buffet's steel drum player. Greenidge treated the crowd to a rare, solo performance along with a few tales of his childhood in Trinidad, the origination of the steel drum, also known as the "pan", as well as the incipiency of Club Trini. Although Greenidge seemed slightly nervous performing alone, he dazzled the audience on two treble pans with Caribbean Sunset, My African Friend, a few additional original pieces and closed with his rendition of Amazing Grace.

The long awaited arrival of the phenomenally talented Peter Mayer followed Greenidge. Peter also took the stage alone, plugged-in, and began the show with Spare Tire Orchestra, the title track from his 5th CD. Check out www.petermayer.com for all of Peter's discography. After finishing his first song, it was indeed time for the 'orchestra' and Peter exclaimed, "Bring out the band!"

In addition to Peter, The Peter Mayer Group (PMG) consists of guitarist Vince Marvel; special percussionist, Scott Bryan; drummer, Roger Guth; and bass guitarist, Jim Mayer. The PMG wowed the audience non-stop for the next hour and a half. The song list was among the absolutely greatest hits of PMG, including the rarely-heard-live Moon Over Paris, written by Buffet's drummer Roger Guth, Chain of Love, for which a congo line ensued, a bosa-nova rendition of India (in recognition of the jazz theme) and encoring with their famous Suzannah, a song inspired by the awesome Key West sunsets.

The Peter Mayer Group typically plays at the annual MOTM convention and has recently included the Lancaster, PA area in their "Stars & Promises" Christmas tour (see Parrot Poop Issue No. 1). Peter and his brother, Jim, grew up in India, sons of missionaries. They attribute a great deal of their musical forte to their grass roots Indian mentors.

If you've never had the chance to see this group, don't miss the opportunity should it pass your way again. In addition to their unique melodic genius, it is worthwhile just to see the love and appreciation of music on the faces of the Mayer brothers in every performance.
