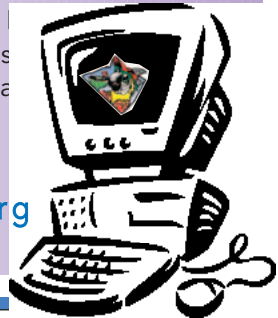

Crime Alert Berks County is a nonprofit volunteer organization of local citizens and business people dedicated to the reduction and prompt solution of crimes, and to rewarding persons who provide information that leads to the arrest of criminals.

Crime Alert provides a 24-hour, toll free anonymous crime tip hotline, email tip line, and mail-in tip program, that offers cash rewards up to \$5,000 for information that leads to the arrest of offenders. Organized 7 years ago, they have paid out over \$50,000 in awards.

- **Crime Alert Cold Cases** – offers double rewards up to \$10,000 for help solving unsolved cold cases which have occurred in Berks County.
- **Cash for Tips Program for Berks County Schools** – helping to keep our schools safe, all Berks County school students are encouraged to call the anonymous tip line about incidents occurring in their schools.
- **Michael H. Wise II Memorial Fund** – almost \$100,000 in funds was raised to go directly to the widow and daughter of Reading Police Officer, Michael Wise.
- **Hometown Heroes** – an annual event to recognize the hard work of our local rescue heroes – fire, police and EMTs. This year's event will be Saturday, September 10th at the Fairgrounds Square Mall parking lot. Join Crime Alert to meet our hometown heroes. Entertainment, kid activities, and local mascots will be available.

Crime Alert is a nonprofit organization. The Parrot Head Club's donation will be used to gather important information to help our police. If you'd like to make a tax deductible donation, please call 610-779-6585 or see one of the Crime Alert volunteers at Parrot Daze III. Please help Crime Alert make our communities a safer place to live and work.

If you have information about a crime or a criminal, you could be eligible to receive a reward of up to \$5,000! You can make a difference.

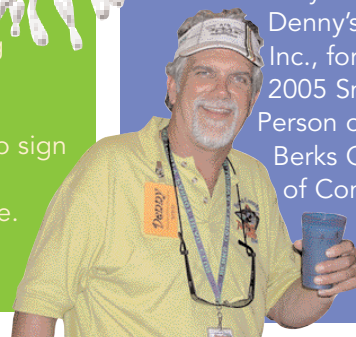

There were two objectives while on the island - besides R&R. The first was happening on day 2 - Friday. Parrot Heads Cheri Jones and Shawn Guevin were getting married on the beach that evening. The bride and groom stated their vows barefoot in the sand under a floral arch, waves rippling in the background. Jeff and Jodi served as official witnesses to the ceremony that was attended by Bob and Lora, Bob and Diane, Matt and Nancy, Dustin, Melissa, and Adrian. At the end of the ceremony, there was a champagne toast while we were entertained by a wandering two-man band. We all retired to the poolside bar for drinks and Cuban cigars to await a celebration dinner at one of the fine restaurants at the hotel.

Saturday was just the kind of relaxing day we all need from time to time - warm and sunny, meeting friends for breakfast, laying on the beach, feeding fish as they swam around while standing in waist-deep, crystal clear water. The perfect beach day!

Our second objective, an excursion to Margaritaville Negril, was fulfilled on Sunday. The hotel got us a driver and we all piled into the van for our side trip. It was a windy but sunny day to start. The Eagles and Vikings were in the playoffs and from the group photo, you can tell which team Cheri and Shawn were cheering for. ("70° and the football game's on.") By the end of the game, our sunny day clouded over and showered us with liquid sunshine.

With only one full day left, most of the gang stayed at the hotel on Monday or walked the beach to the next hotel. It was said the drinks were better there. Adrian, Nancy and I took a second side trip to the Mayfair Falls. This was another eye-opener for me. The driver was the same guy from the day before, "Readdie", but today he was more than just a driver. He was our tour guide taking us past sugarcane fields, stopping along the way to pick wild native herbs and spices, and showing us the more surreal side of his home. This trip involved a bit of hiking and we got wet. It was a guided tour up through the Falls. Our guide "Comfee" carried our valuables in a waterproof bag and referenced many of the native plants along the way. I found this trip to be a nice change from the beach but would not recommend making it without a guide to or from the Falls.

Tuesday arrived and it was evident that our day at Margaritaville would be our last sunny day. We checked-in at the airport and waited at the Margaritaville Restaurant. And what did we hear but Buffett playing on the speakers. It was the first time we heard Buffett's music on the trip! A round of cheeseburgers in paradise helped pass the time. There was one last chance for a souvenir at the gift shop before our flight home. Forecast temperature upon our arrival time in Philadelphia - 17°.
