Angel Fund Update



Latest Angel Fund Distribution and a thank you letter from the recipients.

Another grant was made through the Berks County Parrot Head Club Angel Fund. A total of \$1926 was paid to cover driving lessons and driving exams for 16-year-old twins who live in the Governor Mifflin School District. They live in a single-parent household and their parent is blind. The family is completely dependent on the charity of others to meet their transportation needs. The children actively sought out employment and saved their own money to obtain permits and a vehicle but could not afford to pay for appropriately supervised driving lessons. The children being able to drive will assist the entire family in meeting their daily needs which will be life-changing for this family.

Here is the letter we received from the family:

Beautiful sunrises and sunsets Parrotheads!

I would like to thank you from my mom heart for your generosity with the Angel fund.

I am a single, blind mom of twins. Sometimes life has been easy and sometimes difficult. But someone we all know said... "If life gives you limes, make margaritas."

I believe that it takes a village to raise a family. That family isn't always made of blood.

And when things are not going my way...well..."Breathe in, breathe out, move on."

I kept running into brick walls when it came to getting my kids behind the wheel. But after a month of endless web site searches and fruitless phone calls and asking friends, family and strangers to help...I had to keep saying..."If it doesn't work out, there's never any harm in the fact that you tried."

So, I kept trying and trying. In the mist of all of the grey came the Angel fund. A light of hope. With the kids taking these professional driving lessons, it has made people who originally said no, more comfortable to say yes to taking the kids out.

In 2020 my mom stopped driving. She was limited on her driving as it was but this just made it more difficult. I manage doctor appointments. A typical appointment that would take 30min takes about 4 hours. But this is our lives. When the kids have their license we can grab

something at the store the day we need it! You don't know how important that is. It gives them more opportunities to be more involved and social. It will give them more options as to where to work, instead of just places in walking distance. They have not gotten to the mental state of..."If you ever get annoyed, look at me, I'm self-employed. I love to work at nothing all day."

I try to make their lives easy. But they both worked to pay for their own cars, gas, inspection and insurance. I was determined to help them.

Their lives cant always be..."There's nothing softer than a pile of warm bananas." But we can make it a goal!

Thank you all very much. We wish you good health and blessed days.
